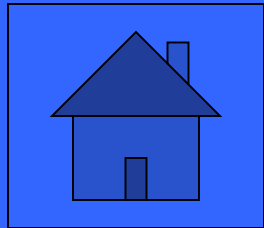

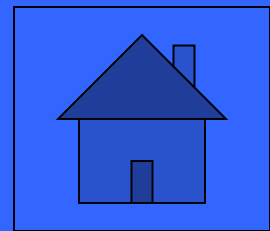

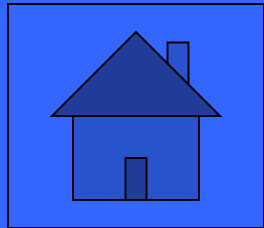

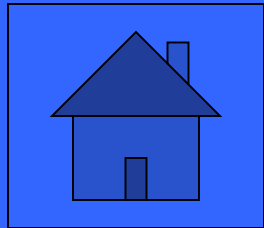

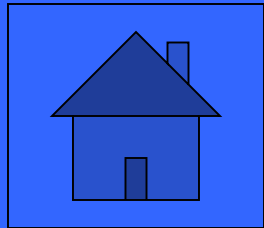

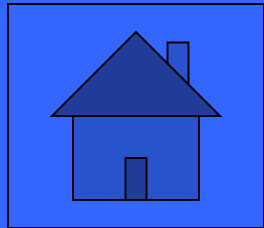

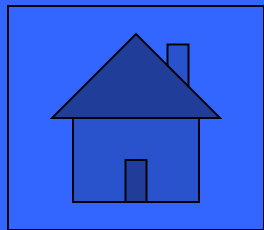

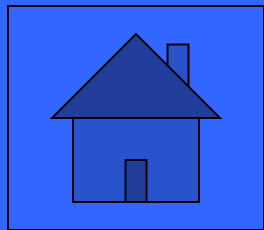

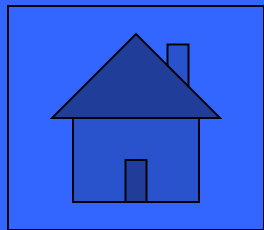

What is dramatic irony?



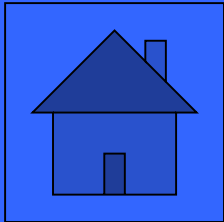
Hindered Friar John from

He says this about a rival (two names):

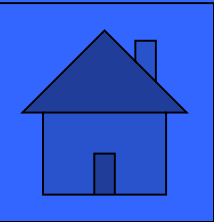

Who is Romeo?



The first time that Romeo and Juliet speak to each other (in original Shakespearean language).

*Romeo: If I profane with my unworhiest hand
This holy shrine, the gentle sin is this:
My lips, two blushing pilgrims, ready stand
To smooth that rough touch with a tender kiss*

*Juliet: Good pilgrim, you do wrong your hand too much,
Which mannerly devotion shows in this,
For saint have hands that pilgrims' hands do touch,
And palm to palm is holy plammers' kiss*

Romeo: Have not saint lips, and holy palmers too?

Juliet: Ay, pilgrim, lips that they must use in prayer.

*Romeo: O, then, dear saint, let lips do what hands do.
They pray; grant thou, lest faith turn to despair.*

Juliet: Saints do not move, though grant for prayers' sake.

Romeo: Then move not, while my prayer's effect I take.
